Computing, Engineering and Mathematics (PhD)

I am writing to confirm that your amendments have now been approved by your examiners and you may go ahead and bind your thesis according to the University Research Degree Regulations (Section 18 and Appendix 1- see extract below). The pages can be printed double-sided to allow binding into one volume.

Permanent Binding

- The binding should be of a fixed type so that leaves cannot be removed or replaced.
- The front and rear boards should have sufficient rigidity to support the weight of the work when standing upright.
- Each volume should not be more than 70mm thick.
- The colour of the binding should be navy blue.
- The outside front board should bear the title of the work in gold leaf in at least 24pt type. The name and initials of the candidate, the qualification and the year of submission should also be shown on the front board.
- The same information (excluding the title of the work) should be shown on the spine of the work. (This requirement applies only to the spine of final permanently bound theses, not to temporary binding)

Perfect binding

- Perfect binding (also known as Temporary or Soft Cover binding). This requirement is not necessary for MPhil theses.
- It should be card front and back with a strip of book cloth covering the spine;
- The pages should be glued together;
- The colour of the card should be pale blue;
- The outside cover should bear the title, the name and initials of the candidate, the qualification and the year of submission should also be shown on the front cover, in black ink Size 24 pt.

Electronic copy

- The PDF file should be sent on a CD to me in the Doctoral College, to be deposited with the University of Brighton Repository for uploading onto the British Library Electronic Thesis Online Service.

Once we receive copies of your thesis, your report forms will be forwarded to the next available Doctoral College Examination Sub-Committee for conferment. Please see below for committee dates and deadlines.
